

Santa Maria del Buon Consiglio ai Monti

(Deconsecrated)



The **church of Santa Maria del Buon Consiglio** is a church of Rome in Rione Monti, in Via del Buon Consiglio at the intersection with Via del Cardello. This church, known previously as *the San Pantaleo Three Furnaces* or after 1587, as *San Biagio ai Monti* (when the same name and a nearby church was destroyed), it seems to date back to the 12th century: in fact, Mariano Armellini reports (p. 145), behind the altar there was a marble stone with an inscription that said the consecration of quell'altare occurred during the pontificate of Pope Paschal II in 1113.

Christian Hülsen reported another inscription, now lost, in which Pope Alexander III on 23 December 1260 confirming the dedication made by his predecessor Pascal II, and appoint the church with the title of *Sancti Pantaleonis in tribus fornix*.

According to tradition, the church was kept hidden the body of the martyr San Pantaleo, when his remains were brought from Nicomedia to Rome.

It was officiated by the Basilian Monks of Grottaferrata until 1635, was entrusted to the clergy.

In 1748 it was granted by Pope Benedict XIV all'Arciconfraternita of Our Lady of Good Counsel, hence the name by which henceforth will be known to the church.

Today the church still the Arciconfraternita entrusted to the Blessed Virgin Mary of Good Counsel, is also headquarters of Comboniana Service Emigrants and Refugees.
